THIS DEED, Made this 26th day of August, 1944, by and between DAN G. FISHER and wife, MILDRED BECK FISHER, of the County of Buncombe and State of North Carolina; EDGAR R. FISHER and wife, CHRISTINE COGGINS FISHER; GLADYS FISHER SMILEY and husband, FRANK W. SMILEY; EDITH FISHER WELCH and husband, ELBERT T. WELCH, all of the County of Swain and State of North Carolina; ELIZABETH FISHER, unmarried, of the County of Jackson and State of North Carolina; and EARNEST W. FISHER, serving with the armed forces of the United States of America, and wife, MARY C. FISHER, of the County of Prince George and State of Maryland, as parties of the first part, and the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA as party of the second part.

WITNESSETH, that the said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of TWENTY-FOUR THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED THREE AND 20/100 Dollars (\$24,103.20) to them paid by the party of the second part, the receipt of which is

hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, its successors and assigns, those certain tracts or parcels of land, situate, lying and being in Swain County, State of North Carolina, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

FR-129:

A tract of land lying in Forneys Creek Township of Swain County, State of North Carolina, on the right bank of the Little Tennessee River, approximately 5/8 mile southwest of the Bushnell Depot, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point (prev. desc. as an iron pipe), a corner of the lands of the Nantahala Power & Light Company, and the D. G. Fisher Heirs (an adjoining tract); thence with the D. G.
