This deed, made this 6 day of June, 1944, by and between James G. Stikeleather, Sr., and wife, Nancy W. Stikeleather, Patrick H. Branch and wife, Florence R. Branch, William M. Smathers and wife, Lillian F. Smathers, Joseph B. Breman and wife, Sara B. Breman, Burnham S. Colburn and wife, Elizabeth G. Colburn, William P. Herbert and wife, Frances C. Herbert, Wachovia Bank and Trust Company, of Asheville, North Carolina, and Mary S. Beadles, Co-Executors of the Estate of N. N. Beadles, Mollie W. Kartus, widow, and William H. Smathers and wife, Mary F. Smathers as Parties of the First Part, James G. Stikeleather, Sr., Patrick H. Branch and William M. Smathers, Trustees, as Parties of the Second Part, and the United States of America as Party of the third part:

Witnesseth, That the Parties of the first Part and the Parties of the Second Part, in consideration of the sum of One Hundred Forty Thousand Two Hundred Seventy-three and 50/100 Dollars (\$140,273.50) to them paid by the Party of the Third Part, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the United States of America, its successors and assigns, those certain tracts or parcels of land, situate, lying and being in Forneys Creek Township of Swain County, State of North Carolina, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

TRACT FR-451:

On the right side of Hazel Creek, approximately 1/4 mile northeast of the State Highway No. 288 bridge across Hazel Creek, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the east right of way line of the abandoned Smoky Mountain Railway, a corner of the lands of Ollie Hall & the Hazel Creek Land Company, and Mrs. Ollie Hall, and the most northeasterly point of the tract herein described; thence with Mrs. Ollie Hall's, Bill Cable et ux's, and H. N. Ballew et ux's line and the said right of way line as it meanders in a general southwesterly direction approximately 2020 feet to a point, a corner of the lands of H. N. Ballew et ux, and L. C. Calhoun; thence, leaving the right of way line, with L. C. Calhoun's line N. 13° 00' W., 55 feet to a point in the northwest right of way line of the said abandoned railway, a corner of the lands of L. C. Calhoun, and H. N. Ballew et ux; thence with H. N. direction approximately 1940 feet to a point, a corner of the lands of Bill Cable et ux, and Ollie Hall & the Hazel Creek Land Company; thence, leaving the right of way line, with Ollie Hall & the Hazel Creek Land Company's line N. 83° 00' E., 85 feet to the point of beginning, and containing 2.2 acres, more or less, subject to such rights as may be vested in the county or state to rights of way for public roads.

TRACT FR-466:

On both banks of Hazel Creek, approximately 1 1/4 miles northeast of the State Highway No. 288 bridge across Hazel Creek, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a poplar tree, a corner of the lands of J. G. Stikeleather et al, (an adjoining tract), and the J. E. Coburn Heirs, and the most southeasterly point of the tract herein described; thence with the J. E. Coburn Heirs' line N 83° 00' W., 1010 feet to a point; thence N. 20° 00' W., 385 feet to a point in the center line of Hazel Creek, a corner of the lands of the J. E. Coburn Heirs, and W. A. Franklin; thence with W. A. Franklin's line N. 20° 00' W., 225 feet, passing a white oak stump at 25 feet and crossing the Possum Hollow Road at approximately 200 feet, to a stake in the center line of an old road; thence with the center line of the old road as it meanders approximately along a bearing and distance of N. 37° 00' E., 470 feet, to a point, a corner of the lands of W. Calhoun's, and Seymour Calhoun's line and the center line of the creek as it meanders upstream approximately 1030 feet, to a point, a corner of the lands of Seymour Calhoun, and J. G. Stikeleather et al (an adjoining tract); thence with J. G. Stikeleather's line S. 23° 30' W., 535 feet, crossing the Possum Hollow Road at approximately 90 feet, to the point of beginning. EXCEPT therefrom 1.7 acres, more or less, owned by the Swain County Board of Education, and designated as Tract No. FR-1223, lying within the boundaries of the land herein described, approximately 500 feet west of the point in the center line of Hazel Creek which is a common corner of the lands of Lillie C. Calhoun, Seymour Calhoun, and J. G. Stikeleather et al, the said 1.7 acres being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point in a public road, a corner to the land of J. G. Stikeleather et al; thence with J. G. Stikeleather's line S. 81° 00' E., 270 feet to a point; thence with a hedge row for the first approximate 60 feet S. 12° 00' W., 281 feet to a point; thence N. 79° 00' W., 288 feet to a point in the center line of a public road; thence with the center line of the road as it meanders approximately along the following bearings and distances: N. 14° 00' E., 100 feet; N. 1° 00' E., 190 feet; to the point of beginning.

The above described tract of land contains 26.8 acres, more or less, subject to such rights as may be vested in the county or state to a road which affects approximately 0.8 acre and to any other rights of way for public roads traversing the described land.

Beginning at a point on the right bank of Hazel Creek and in the northeast right of way line of the abandoned Smoky Mountain Railway, a corner of the lands of the J. E. Coburn Heirs, and C. L. Millsaps et ux, and the most northerly point of the tract herein described; thence with C. L. Millsaps', Bill Crane's, W. D.
