THIS DEED, Made this 29th day of April, A.D. 1931, by and between CHAMPION FIBRE COMPANY, a Corporation chartered and organized under the laws of the State of Ohio, hereinafter called GRANTOR, and THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA, hereinafter called GRANTEE:

W I T N E S S E T H:

That the said Grantor, for and in consideration of the sum of Ten Dollars and for certain other good and valuable considerations moving it thereto, to it paid by the Grantee, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, has bargained and sold, and by these presents does hereby bargain, sell and convey unto the said Grantee, its successors and assigns forever the following described lands and interests in lands lying and being on the waters of Ocona Lufty River and its tributaries, the waters of Deep Creek and its tributaries, the waters of Noland Creek and its tributaries, and other streams, in Swain County, North Carolina, and more particularly described as follows:-

FIRST TRACT

Being Tract No. 1 of the survey made by the North Carolina Park Commission of the lands embraced in the GREAT SMOKY MOUNTAINS NATIONAL PARK, and more particularly described as follows:-

(NOTE: All bearings in this description were turned from the true meridian and all distances are expressed in chains of 66 feet.)

BEGINNING at Corner 1, a point where the "John Gray Blount" Line crosses Hughes Ridge. Set a post in a mound of stone. A 31" chestnut bears N. 14° W., .24 chain distant; A 36" black oak bears N. 45° E., .25 chain distant.
