THIS DEED, Made this _____ April, A. D. , 1929, by and between Roscoe A. Marvel and wife Marie N. Marvel, of Buncombe County, North Carolina, hereinafter called Grantors, whether one or more and THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA, hereinafter called Grantee:

W I T N E S S E T H:

That the said Grantors for certain good and valuable considerations moving them thereto, and particularly the sum of (\$) Dollars to them paid by the Grantee the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold and by these presents do hereby bargain, sell and convey unto the said Grantee, its successors and assigns, the following described lands in Forney's Creek Township, Swain County, State of North Carolina, particularly described as follows, viz:

Lying on the watershed of Twenty Mile Creek,

The Grantors covenant to and with the grantee, its successors and assigns That they are the owners of and are seized of the premises in fee; that they have good right to convey the same in fee simple; that the said premises are free and clear from encumbrances except as hereinafter stated; and that they will forever warrant and defend their title to said premises against the claims of any and all persons whatsoever.
