This cause coming on to be heard, and being heard, before His Honor, J. H. Clement, Judge Presiding, at the September Term, 1932, of the Superior Court of Buncombe County, upon appeals from a decree of the Clerk of the Superior Court of Buncombe County in this cause, the same being a condemnation proceeding heretofore properly and regularly constituted, heard and determined before said Clerk; and an issue having been submitted to and answered by the jury as follows, to-wit:-

"What compensation are the respondents entitled to receive from the petitioner on account of the taking by condemnation of the lands set forth and described in the petition?

Answer: \$ 600,000.00 ;"

NOW, THEREFORE, IN THE PREMISES AFORESAID, IT IS CONSIDERED, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COURT, as follows:-

I.

That the title to a one-half (1/2) undivided interest in and to all and singular the lands, premises and real estate described in the petition in this proceeding, and in the exhibit hereto attached and marked "Exhibit A," shall, ex instanti, and is hereby declared, to pass to and vest in the petitioner, the State of North Carolina, in fee simple, for the uses and purposes expressed and declared in the petition and in Chapter 48, Public Laws of North Carolina, Session of 1927, and any and all acts supplementary thereto and amendatory thereof, free and discharged of and from all adverse claims, liens and encumbrances whatsoever; and the respondents and all other persons whomsoever, as well such person or persons not parties to this proceeding, if any, as the parties hereto, are forever barred from claiming or asserting any manner of estate or interest in the said one-half (1/2) undivided interest in said lands, premises and real estate, either legal or equitable whatsoever, the person or persons not parties hereto, having or claiming such estate or interest, if any being hereby remitted solely to the right of recourse upon the money paid into Court by the petitioner, and to follow said moneys or any part thereof into the hands of any person or persons having the same without good right thereto.

II.

That of the sum of \$300,000.00 paid into the office of the Clerk of the Superior Court of Buncombe County, as the award for the said one-half (1/2) undivided interest in and to said lands, premises and real estate described in the petition in this proceeding, and in the exhibit hereto attached and marked "Exhibit A," \$100,000.00 shall be paid immediately to Johnson, Smathers and Rollins, Attorneys of Record for the Respondents, and the remainder thereof, or the sum of \$200,000.00, shall be held by the

said Clerk of the Superior Court of Buncombe County to await a determination with respect to any taxes, claims, liens or encumbrances subsisting and outstanding against or upon said lands, premises and real estate; and at a civil term of the Superior Court of Buncombe County to be held in October or November, 1932, the presiding judge shall ascertain upon proper enquiry, after notice to the Attorney General of North Carolina and Johnson, Smathers and Rollins, Attorneys of Record for the respondents, the amount of any such taxes, claims, liens or encumbrances against or upon said lands, premises and real estate, and shall make his findings of fact and enter his order thereon, setting forth the amount of said taxes, claims, liens or encumbrances, which findings of fact and order shall be filed with the papers in this cause and be a part of the record herein. It then shall be the duty of the said Clerk of the Superior Court of Buncombe County to retain a sufficient amount out of said sum of \$200,000.00 to pay off, discharge and cancel any and all such taxes, claims, liens or encumbrances on said lands, premises and real estate, together with ^{any} interest, penalties or costs attaching or accruing thereon or in connection therewith; and the said Clerk of the Superior Court of Buncombe County, out of said sum of \$200,000.00, shall pay off, discharge and cancel of record all such taxes, claims, liens or encumbrances, and the balance or remainder of said sum of \$200,000.00, the said Clerk of the Superior Court of Buncombe County shall pay into the hands of Johnson, Smathers and Rollins, Attorneys of Record for the respondents, for the use and benefit of the said respondents, and the receipt of said attorneys for any and all parts of said award of \$300,000.00 shall be sufficient voucher and acquittance of the petitioner and the Clerk of the Superior Court of Buncombe County for the payment of said sum or sums for the use of said respondents, and in satisfaction of the award for the said one-half (1/2) undivided interest in said lands, premises and real estate.

III.

That the sum of \$300,000.00 which is hereby found and declared to be the award for the remaining one-half (1/2) undivided interest in and to all and singular the lands, premises and real estate described in the petition, and in said "Exhibit A," may be paid into the office of the Clerk of the Superior Court of Buncombe County by the petitioner in units of \$50,000.00 or more, and upon the payment of any of such units, or the whole of said sum, the title to such fractional part of said remaining one-half (1/2) undivided interest in, or the whole of said tract of land, premises and real estate, as the case may be, as any such payments shall bear to, or be the whole or the total of the balance or remainder of such award, or the sum of \$300,000.00, shall, eo instanti, pass to and vest in the petitioner, the State of North Carolina, for the uses and purposes expressed and declared in said petition and in Chapter 48, Public Laws of North Carolina, Session of 1927, and any and all acts supplementary thereto and amendatory thereof, free and discharged of and from all adverse claims, liens and encumbrances whatsoever; and the respondents and all other persons whosoever, as well such person or persons not parties to this proceeding, if any, as the parties hereto, are forever barred from claiming or asserting any manner of estate or interest in and to said lands, premises and real estate, either legal or equitable whatsoever, the person or persons not parties hereto, having or claiming such estate or interest, if any, being hereby remitted solely to the right of recourse upon the money so paid into Court by the Petitioner, and to follow the same into the hands of any person or persons having the same without good right thereto; and the Court shall, upon the payment of any such units, or the whole of said award, enter such other and firther judgments or judgments in assurance and confirmation of the title to such lands, premises and real estate, as may be desired and required by the petitioner.

IV.

That the respondents shall not be entitled to or receive interest on the unpaid balance of said award, or sum of \$300,000.00, or any part thereof, until on and after October 1, 1933, but said respondents shall be entitled to and receive interest on any such portion of said award, or sum of \$300,000.00, which shall remain unpaid on and after October 1, 1933; and the said petitioner shall be responsible for and save the respondents harmless from the payment of any and all ad valorem or property taxes, legally and properly assessed against said lands, premises and real estate described in the petition in this proceeding, and in the exhibit hereto attached marked "Exhibit A," for the years 1932, 1933 and 1934, and from all corporate franchise taxes assessed by the State of North Carolina against the respondent, Suncrest Lumber Company, for the years 1932, 1933 and 1934, and which said corporate franchise taxes may grow out of, be a consequence of, and assessed against said respondent, Suncrest Lumber Company, by reason of its ownership of the said lands, premises and real estate, or into the determination of which the value or ownership of said lands, premises and real estate enters into or becomes a factor.

V.

That the order heretofore made in this cause by His Honor, P. A. McElroy, Resident Judge of the Superior Court for the Nineteenth Judicial District, on April 25, 1931, directing the setting aside of a separate and distinct fund as a special deposit in the sum of \$75,000.00, in lieu of an additional bond by petitioner in this cause, be, and the same is hereby, rescinded, revoked and set aside, and the said special deposit in the sum of \$75,000.00, and any interest accrued thereon, heretofore and now carried by the American Trust Company, of Charlotte, North Carolina, in the name of "North Carolina Park Commission-Special Account," be, and the same is hereby, declared to be the property of the petitioner and its agency, the North Carolina Park Commission, and the said American Trust Company is hereby ordered and directed to pay the said sum out upon the voucher of the said North Carolina Park Commission.

VI.

That any and all bonds heretofore executed by the North Carolina Park Commission as principal and the United States Fidelity and Guaranty Company as surety, under the orders of the Superior Court of Buncombe County in this cause, shall be immediately canceled, and notice thereof given to the surety as a condition of this judgment.

VII.

That the decree hereinbefore rendered in this cause by the Clerk of the Superior Court of Buncombe County, dated October 26, 1931, is hereby, in all respects, confirmed and approved, except as the same is changed and modified by the terms of this judgment.

VIII.

That a certified copy of this judgment, and of Exhibit A hereto attached, shall be filed in the office of the Register of Deeds of Haywood County, North Carolina, and in the office of the Register of Deeds of Swain County, North Carolina, and there registered, as provided by law.

IX.

That the term, "respondents," as used in this decree, shall apply only to Suncrest Lumber Company, First Union Trust & Savings Bank, Successor to Union Trust Company, and Frederick H. Rawson, Trustees, and the remaining respondents shall not be considered as respondents in respect of this judgment, it appearing to the Court that the rights of the other respondents have been adjusted and determined.

X.

And that the petitioner shall pay the costs of this proceeding, to be taxed by

the Clerk.
