

1. The Oconaluftee tracts in red with a heavy black border at bottom center were taken by the NC Park Commission and donated to the Federal Government for the Park. The Park Service later sold those tracts to the Eastern Band of the Cherokee Indians. The Park Service retained the money paid by the EBCI. The property transfer was not registered, as required by NC law, and the State of NC, which had purchased and donated the lands to the Park Service, received none of the money paid for the land.
