REPORT ON THE WILLIAM STILES TRACT NO. 121---62.83 ACRES.

Location: This tract is located on Indian Creek, a tributary of Deep Creek about five miles from Bryson City and adjoins the lands of Champion Fibre Company and other small property owners.

Description: A nice mountain farm occupied by the widow, eight acres of flat land along the creek, which is productive and eight acres in an upper field which is also productive. Twenty acres in timber land has been cut over but a good stand of timber is left.

Improvements: The improvements are a four room box house, a good barn, smoke house and crib, all of which are in good condition. The eight acres of flat land is fenced and well cared for and the upper field is fenced. There are about ninety young fruit trees well cared for.

Analysis of Title

Tract 121.

William Stiles - 62.83 Acres.

Tract 121 is covered entirely by Grant 587 to Love, Battle and Welch, now owned by the Champion Fibre Co. The title of most of this tract, however, is derived through a bond for title from W. H. Thomas to James Baird and we have not been able to find any connection whatever with grant 587 for this portion of the tract. Two small tracts adjoining the lands covered by the bond for title from W. H. Thomas to James Baird, however, were acquired from the Champion Fibre Company of the lands covered by grant 587. The title to these separate portions composing 121 will now be considered.

1. W. H. Thomas, executed a Bond for Title to James Baird dated March 10, 1874, covering a tract of 100 acres of land to include the improvements of said Baird, I. Hughes and William Shuler and to be an oblong square. The description in this Bond for Title is very vague and indefinite and not sufficient to cover any particular tract for 100 acres. It is recorded in Swain County. Page

659 of this Abstract.

2. James R. Thomas, Guardian of W. H. Thomas, by deed dated November 12, 1890, conveyed to James Baird a tract of 100 acres on the waters of Indian Creek covering most of tract 121 and all of tract 122. This deed recites the Bond for Title theretofore given by W. H. Thomas to James Baird and that all of the purchase money for said lands had been paid to William H. Thomas. The proceeding under which this deed was made authorizing the said James R. Thomas Guardian, to make said deed is not of record in Swain County but is recorded in Jackson County. This proceeding is set out in the title of tract _____ at page _____. It is not very material for the reason that it will be necessary to rely upon adverse possession for this tract, this deed constituting color of title upon which said possession is based. This deed is recorded in Swain County. Page 660 of Abstract.

3. James Baird and wife, E.J. Baird, then conveyed to V. B. Massey, by deed dated January 16, 1907, the 100 acre tract described in the last named deed. This deed is recorded in Swain County. Page 661 of this Abstract.

4. V. B. Massey and wife, Hattie Massey, then conveyed to W.W. Wheeler and G.F. Miller, by deed dated June 29, 1912, the 100 acre tract described in the last two named deeds. This deed is recorded in Swain County. Page 662 of Abstract.

5. G. F. Miller and wife, A.L. Miller, by deed dated December 3, 1912, conveyed to W. W. Wheeler, their one-half interest in the same tract of 100 acres. This deed is recorded in Swain Co. Page 663 of Abstract.

6. W. W. Wheeler and wife, Alma Wheeler, then conveyed to W. T. Stiles, by deed dated January 16, 1915, all of said tract of 100 acres, excepting therefrom the tract of 56 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres. The tract so excepted constitutes tract 122 which had been conveyed by W. W. Wheeler and wife to Baxter Loney. This deed is recorded in Swain County. Page 664 of this Abstract.

7. The title of the Champion Fibre Co. under grant 587 is identical with the title to tract 172, pages 46 to 134 inclusive and including deeds from George Spears Reynolds, Special Master to Harris Woodbury Lumber Company and deed from Whittier Lumber Company to Harris Woodbury Lumber Company. Reference for this title is made to Abstract 172 and will also be fully set out in the Abstract of title to Tract 1.

8. Harris Woodbury Lumber Company conveyed to Champion Fibre Company by deed dated day 18, the lands covered by grant 587 and including that portion of tract 121, conveyed by the deeds hereinafter set out from the Champion Fibre Company to W. T. Stiles. This deed is recorded in Swain County. Page 665 of Abstract.

9. The Champion Fibre Company, by deed dated April 17, 1923, conveyed to W. T. Stiles and wife, Docia Stiles, two small tracts of land, one containing eight acres, and the other containing six acres, both of which adjoin the lands conveyed by the said Stiles to W. W. Wheeler and wife and being a part of tract 121. This deed reserves to the Champion Fibre Company, its heirs and assigns a right of way through and over said two pieces of land for the purpose of constructing, operating and maintaining a railroad, road and tram road for the purpose of getting out the timber, lumber, etc. from the lands of said Champion Fibre Company lying back of and around said two tracts of land. This deed is recorded in Swain County.

10. W.T. Stiles and wife, Docia Stiles, by deed dated May 5, 1923, conveyed to the Champion Fibre Company the right to construct and operate a railroad or tram road through and over the "tract of land on Indian Creek where the said W. T. Stiles now resides". This deed is recorded in Swain County. Page 667 of this Abstract.

11. While it has not been possible to connect the record title of that portion of tract 121 derived through the deed from W. W. Wheeler and wife, with the title to grant 587, we call attention to the affidavit of , showing that this tract has been in long continuous occupation by W. L. Stiles and those under whom he claims. This affidavit is set out on page 668 of this Abstract.

12. On the subject of possession we also call attention to the fact that this tract, while a portion of it is covered by grant 587, it is not now claimed by the Champion Fibre Company.

In the deed executed by this company to W. T. Stiles and wife hereinbefore referred to, reference is made in the description to the Baird tract and the tract upon which W. T. Stiles and his wife then resided, and apparently the Champion Fibre Company at that time recognized the title of said Stiles to that tract.

We also call attention to the fact that the Champion Fibre Company secured and excepted from W. T. Stiles and wife, a deed for a right of way over the Stiles home tract and referred to it as the tract upon which the said Stiles then resided.
